Tutoring and Lecturing

Comment: Introduction to the history of philosophy, focusing on Plato, Aristotle, Descartes, Locke, Berkeley, Hume and Kant.

Comment: Introduction to moral and political philosophy, covering various topics in meta- and normative ethics. I lectured on deontology the second time I taught on the module.
- How to Think Clearly and Argue Well, 2017.
Comment: Introduction to critical thinking and logic, focusing mostly on fallacies, predicate logic, and propositional logic.
- Knowledge, Self and Reality, 2018.
Comment: Introduction to theoretical philosophy, focusing on metaphysics and epistemology.

Comment: Extended introduction to epistemology, featuring discussions of justification, knowledge, sources of knowledge, *a priori* vs. *a posteriori* knowledge, etc., for 2nd year undergraduates. I lectured on coherentism about justification.

Comment: Extended introduction to metaethics, featuring all of its main issues and branches, for 3rd year undergraduates. I lectured on Ayer and expressivism.

Comment: Applied/normative ethics module about ethical issues concerning life and death, for 2nd year undergraduates.
